### **Part One: Preliminary Items**

#### **1. Welcome and Apologies**

As an advisory body of Senate the Committee was able to agree its own Terms of Reference. The Committee agreed the revised Terms of Reference and asked that the revised Terms be appended to the minutes of the meeting for Senate to note.

#### **6. Report from the VP Education, Students' Union**

The Students' Union were heavily engaged in 2015 Welcome Week; the Committee received apologies from the VP Education and understood the clash of commitments. The VP Education would be invited to provide an update from the SU at the next meeting of the Committee.

### **Part Three: Report from Pro-Vice Chancellor, Research and Enterprise**

7. The Pro-Vice Chancellor (Research and Enterprise) updated members of the Committee on work being undertaken to restructure the Research and Enterprise Office; to improve the visibility of potential doctoral projects on the web; and to increase funding support to doctoral students. The Committee was advised that the proposed restructure of the Research and Enterprise Office did not directly affect doctoral students as the majority of

support for doctoral students was located within Schools. Members of the Committee, however, were advised to encourage colleagues in their Schools to seek additional funding for doctoral students, such as through Knowledge Transfer Partnerships (KTPs) and Marie Skłodowska-Curie fellowships, with the help of colleagues in the Research and Enterprise Office. Members of the Committee were asked to forward information on potential doctoral projects to the City Graduate School Office so that they could be further publicised through the City Graduate School website.

#### **Part Four: Items for discussion**

##### **8. Postgraduate Research Learning Outcomes (research degree completion rates)**

The Committee considered the draft action plan on improving University research degree completion rates, which had been compiled following consideration by Senate of the Review of the City Graduate School, and made the following comments:

1. there was a need to clarify whether the maximum period of candidature referred to *completion*, or to *submission*, within the time period (currently 4 or 7 years for full or part-time students respectively).
2. completion rates were not the only metric by which to measure the quality of a research degree programme; sole/co-authored publications and placement opportunities were also measures of quality.
3. students (and supervisors) should be made aware of what was expected of them at the outset, especially during the admission stage.

The Committee additionally asked that the data be amended to reflect the distribution of completion, perhaps by using the median time to completion rather than the mean. Members endorsed the action plan but were invited to send any further comments to the Graduate School before it was considered by ExCo at its meeting on 5 October 2015 and Senate on 14 October 2015. Subject to these comments the Committee supported the paper being sent to University ExCo for comment prior to being sent to Senate for discussion.

There were no other items of business. The Committee noted the timing and frequency of meetings during 2015/16.

## Graduate School Committee

### Terms of Reference

The Graduate School Committee will act in an advisory capacity to the Dean of the City Graduate School to support him in his role in overseeing and managing the University's research degree provision, including those aspects delegated to him by Senate. The Dean of Validation will be consulted on relevant business of the Graduate School that impacts on validated research degree provision. The City Graduate School Committee has specific delegated authority from Senate:

(i) to monitor and advise on all aspects of academic quality, standards for research degrees and research degree provision; and

(ii) to make responses on behalf of the University to sector-wide initiatives, consultations and other national and international developments concerning research student activity and provision

Additionally, the Graduate School Committee will report to Education and Student Committee on matters relating to the Education and Student Strategy. The Committee will provide oversight and direction for the hubs identified by the Education and Student Strategy (ESS), and will facilitate and lead on the development of research degree provision within these areas. This includes the identification of local level activity and projects that might be developed; monitoring progress of any established projects; evaluating impact and helping students get the most from their studies and engagement with City.

Specific areas in which the Graduate School Committee will provide advice and support to the Dean of the City Graduate School include:

1. development, management and monitoring of ESS activities specifically related to research degree provision, including:

(i) Research skills training provision across the University, overseeing the delivery of advanced training provision for research degree students

(ii) Enhancing the research student environment and experience

(iii) Research student progression, completion and completion rates

(iv) Publications and other short- and long-term outputs coming from research student work

(v) Research student employability

(vi) The dissemination of good practices that relate to research students (involving students, staff and processes) across the University, promoting a coherence where appropriate that enhances the effectiveness and visibility of the University as a research-led institution.

The group will do this by:

a) agreeing priorities on an annual basis

- b) reviewing draft project plans against commitments and objectives in the ESS
  - c) ensuring that resource is used effectively
  - d) ensuring that there are no gaps in key areas, or overlap of activity.
2. supporting the enhancement of existing work that contributes to the strategy ('areas of strength').
  3. supporting the work of Learning and Teaching Committees and Professional Services on activities and projects aligned with the strategy and revising reports on progress towards each of the ESS hub destinations
  4. tracking and reporting progress to the Education & Student Strategy Projects Board (if/when established) and Education and Student Committee.
5. the formulation, review and development of the University's research degree regulations, frameworks, policies and procedures for recommendation to Senate for approval
6. the promotion, monitoring and review of processes pertaining to the following aspects of research degree provision and recommending actions to be taken for reporting to Senate taking account of disciplinary differences that exist between fields
