CAUSE FOR CONCERN

The purpose of the cause for concern form is to make certain that the student is aware of the concern at the earliest possible stage of his/her training and that a supportive action plan can be agreed between all three parties, student, university and hospital. It is far better to report a cause for concern which then disappears than to wait hoping for an improvement which does not materialise, as it may be too late to make an effective intervention. The person instigating the cause for concern form should at the same time inform the student that the process has been started.

A cause for concern form should be initiated in cases of: -

- Lack of Progress

A student radiographer is considered to be failing, or is judged to be in danger of failing to meet the required standards for the particular phase of the course.

- Lack of Professionalism

For example: punctuality, dress, lack of critical self awareness, unable or unwilling to accept professional criticism, difficult relationships with staff.

- Professional Misconduct

The student is considered to be behaving in a way which is professionally unacceptable.

Copies of the form must go to the student, link lecturer and administration.
