General pre-requisites

Applicants for Level 2000 courses should have a background in the subject area, for example one or two successfully passed university level courses in the subject area or with transferable skills/knowledge.

Applicants for Level 3000 courses should be a major in that subject or have extensive knowledge of the subject area.

Credit

All courses on the Study Abroad Programme are worth 15 UK credits/7.5 ECTS, and most US universities award 4 US credits. A full load at City is 60 credits.

Results and transcript

Students studying in Autumn 2024 would expect to receive their results and official transcript from mid-February 2025.
